

<u>Notes:</u> any requests to fly any other flags, and/or the above on any other dates, such requests to be directed to the Town Clerk. Decisions will be made with due regard to:

- i) Planning group (a) and (b) guidance as published in Flying flags: a Plain English Guide;
- ii) Precedent set by flying of the flag over buildings representing Her Majesty's Government;
- iii) Recommendations from The College of Arms, the official heraldic authority for England.

How to fly flags:

• Never fly flags before sunrise or after sunset (apart from Town Flag for Civic Ball/Civic Service/Annual Meeting). Ideally 8am until sunset.
