# **General Manager's Overview** <u>MONTHLY REPORT MARCH/APRIL 25</u> <u>Council Project based Summary</u>

## **Guildhall Refurbishment**

Project update:

- Works to the flood defence arrangements for the Guildhall are nearing completion, a contractual omission has been agreed with regards to electronic door furniture and RM Builders are taking over the obligation to arrange for repairs to the flexistep lift.
- Regular meetings have been held with regard to developing an event for the VE Day Celebrations on 8<sup>th</sup> May 25 in partnership with Tavistock BID and others with the final schedule being issued after a focus group meeting planned for 16<sup>th</sup> April 25.
- A Heritage Alliance meeting was held on 19<sup>th</sup> March.
- Repairs to the BMS have been commissioned for the Guildhall heating system primarily relating to outdoor sensors and main entrance air curtain.
- Etched glass safety stickers have been installed on the main entrance automatic sliding doors and a new sign has been installed on the entrance desk advertising that the Guildhall Gateway Interpretation Centre is free of charge.
- Guildhall free talks scheduled this month and next include, 17<sup>th</sup> April Dartmoor Prison, 25<sup>th</sup> murder of PC Potter, 8<sup>th</sup> May RAF Harrowbeer and 23<sup>rd</sup> May History of ten tours.
- On 22<sup>nd</sup> May the Robing Room is booked for the Dementia Memory Café day.

## Guildhall toilets provision

Project update:

• Standing item, no change from previous. Next steps when the requested information is received will include a wider discussion around the future of public welfare provision as a whole for Tavistock.

## Museum Structural Works

Project update:

- Recently window repairs (including pinning mouldings) have been carried out and additional repointing to the museum frontage around the tower section has been completed.
- Between Tavistock Museum/TTC funding opportunities are being explored in relation to applying for grants, including enveloping repairs and improving internal heating systems.

 Whilst exploring such funding opportunities, a strategy is being developed to address further dry rot and settlement issues.

#### • Operational Update

- Abbey Remains Project: Unfortunately, the Abbey Remains Group were unsuccessful with their recent grant application to NLHF. Your Officers have discussed the matter with NLHF and have been advised a re-submission would be encouraged if identified unsecured funding (e.g. £200,000 hypothecated to Historic England) was secured. A lengthy discussion with Historic England has been undertaken post the above news, and an approach has been agreed re: submitting the grant application to Historic England, focussing on repair works to Betsy Grimbals Tower only, total project costs £250,000 including professional fees, with the aim to submit the application by week commencing 21<sup>st</sup> April, determination date up to 2 months. If successful, a resubmission to NLHF will follow. Dependent on funding success, capital improvement works are scheduled to start in early 26.
- Multi-use wheeled sports area: Following the Special Council Meeting held on 1<sup>st</sup> April 25, a pre-start meeting has been arranged with the preferred tenderer, Tavi Skate and the Council for 16<sup>th</sup> April.
- The Commercial and Community Service Improvement Plan 25/26 will be submitted to Budget and policy on 13<sup>th</sup> May for consideration.
- From a compliance perspective, arising from the pot hole register inspections, a programme of works has been completed, IRO £5,000 for resurfacing works/pot hole repairs. The next inspection is scheduled for May/June 25.
- Works to Abbey Walk and Market Rd retaining walls have been completed with protective fencing now removed.
